NEW HAMPSHIRE EMPLOYMENT SECURITY

New Hampshire Employment Security (NHES) supports workers through times of unemployment, matches job seekers with employers, provides employers with information and assistance to build a quality workforce, and provides businesses and individuals with the information they need to adapt to a changing economy.

UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE: The Unemployment Insurance (UI) benefits provide temporary financial assistance to unemployed workers who have lost their job through no fault of their own, while they look for work. To collect benefits, you must be ready, willing, and able to work. To qualify for UI benefits, you must have enough work and wages in covered employment.

FOR JOB SEEKERS: NHES is the place to start when you're looking for your first job, your next job, a better job, or a new career. We have free services, resources, and tools to help you with the entire job search process. You do not need to be claiming unemployment benefits or be out of work to use this service.

JOB AND RESOURCE FAIRS: Job fairs help job seekers seeking employment, and assist employees, like speed dating, but finding the right employment match. To view upcoming Job and Resource Fairs, visit us at: www.nhes. nh.gov/media/job-fairs or call: (603) 228-4083.

VETERANS LOOKING FOR A JOB: NHES provides priority of service to veterans and eligible spouses for employment and training services. If you are a veteran, contact a NHES office for a veterans' representative.

THE RETURN TO WORK INITIATIVE is a voluntary program to provide a structured, supervised training opportunity to unemployed, non-claiming New Hampshire residents, and eligible New Hampshire claimants, while continuing to collect unemployment compensation. The training program is up to six weeks, and a maximum of 24 hours per week.

THE JOB MATCH SYSTEM (JMS) enables job seekers to conduct a job search using Internet spider technology to view jobs posted by employers and match skills to positions posted on national job boards and private industry web sites.

OUR RESOURCE CENTERS: You can also visit your local NHES office in-person. Our resource centers provide job seekers with computer access to job listings throughout the state and the nation. Most local offices have jobs posted on bulletin boards and help wanted ads from local newspapers. Some offices also provide opportunities to meet with employers and armed forces recruiters.

WORKFORCE INNOVATION AND OPPORTUNITY ACT (WIOA)

The Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) is a federally-funded re-employment and job training program that assists dislocated workers. Each NH Works Career Center has WIOA Employment Career Navigators who can assist you with the following services:

- **Resume Preparation:** Assistance in creating a well-prepared resume that makes a good impression.
- Career Decision Making: Your WIOA Career Navigator will discuss your work experience and talents and may provide you skills assessment tests to help determine a career path.
- Interviewing Techniques: Learn the key elements of a good interview and how to use them.
- Training Opportunities: WIOA Career Navigators will discuss all the job retraining programs eligible to you, including Individual Training Accounts and high school equivalency certificate or diploma attainment.
- Paid On-The-Job Training: Helping a prospective employee with wage reimbursement, an incentive you can use to help you get hired.
- Support Services: Transportation, license, day care, may be provided as needed.
